2009 Legislative Priorities

- 1) Oppose efforts that erode funding for vital community services that negatively impact Californian's access to parks, open space, after school programming, senior services, facilities that promote physical activity, protect natural resources, and strengthen safety and security
- 2) Support legislation that promotes access to joint use of schools; parks and open space; development of streets and trails that encourage physical activity and healthy living
- 3) Promote policies that recognize the benefits of parks and recreational facilities in the advancement of "sustainable communities" and curbing green house gas emissions.
 - Work to strengthen policies that fund parks, open-space, bike lanes and non-motorized trails through the development and implementation of a carbon credit and offset program.
 - Advocate for the strong integration of local and regional park and non-motorized transportation improvements into "Smart Growth Scenarios" pursuant to SB 375.
