CPRS Leadership Summit

CPRS Headquarters held a virtual training summit on Thursday, September 4, 2020 for professionals in leadership positions in CPRS. The CPRS board recruited experienced performance, engagement, and motivitional speaker, Marilyn Sherman, as the keynote speaker who led two discussions for the day. Below are some takeaways we believe may be useful to our members.

Take Charge in your Career

1

Appreciate your seat. Keep track of your wins. Maintain a 'win list': accomplishments, feel good moments, times you received recognition.



Define what you want. Don't assume people know. What does what you want truly look like?



Determine WHO needs to know. Be intentional. Set-up a time, plead your case, ask for next steps (don't give ultimatum). Follow up.

Get the description of the job that you want. What are the certifications, experience, requirements? Fill in the gaps.



Ask. Don't be intimidated- ask for what you want. Find someone in the job you want- and ask for advice to get to their position.



Avoid the traps.

Chasing a title alone can be disappointing or feel emptychase desired influence to be more impactful.



Create opportunities. Don't just dress for the job you want. Act like the job and believe you can do it. First, listen and observe, then contribute (add value).



Build your bench. Find people who can support you. Mentor: discuss fears, choices, provide feedback. Advocate: knows what you do and can advocate on your behalf. Sponsor: has the influence/power to make something happen.



Look for your bigger picture. Think legacy. Strive for significance versus success. You leave a legacy either way, so have it be intentional. - 66 Have a bad moment, not a bad day. -Marilyn Sherman

"There's no such thing as a bad day, only bad moments that people choose to nurse all day long!" Consider that you can **choose** to let a bad moment (or two) ruin the day. Instead, take the perspective that they were just instances and don't have to define the entire course of the day.

CITY OF SAN DIEGO POOL LIFEGUARDS PIVOT TO HELP THOSE CURRENTLY EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS DURING COVID19



From City Pools to the San Diego Convention Center

HOW POOL GUARDS ASSISTED At the convention center

When COVID19 hit San Diego, swimming pools in the City of San Diego were closed like many other pools around the county. Although pools were closed, the City of San Diego Pool Guards and Pool Managers were called to duty at the San Diego Convention Center. The "Operation Shelter to Home" transformed the Convention Center into a safe, clean space that welcomed San Diegans who were previously living on the street or in City bridge shelters. The Operation serves over 1,300 clients, and provides around the clock services including meals, showers, laundry services, outdoor activity spaces, case management, mental and behavioral health services, 24-hour security, health screenings, Wi-Fi access and housing navigation. Over 300 clients have transitioned into permanent housing, thanks to the hard work and support of Parks and **Recreation Department Staff!**


RECREATION STAFF Serve Lunches

City of San Diego Pool Guards and Recreation Leaders have proved to have a vital role in serving the community outside of just recreation. They have filled in the gaps throughout the county by helping to distribute meals at 26 school sites and 17 recreation centers. Hundreds of thousands of lunches were served by Parks and Rec staff! Go team! In addition to supporting the "Operation Shelter to Home" and serving lunches, Pool Guards and Recreation Leaders have pivoted in other ways, by supporting golf course operations, grounds maintenance and landscaping projects and open space activities. Pool Lifeguards ensure that the public are safe and abide by the rules of the pool... and the trails! After COVID19 hit, the usage of trails has gone way up. Donned with sunscreen and whistles, you can find Pool Guards at trailheads promoting social distancing and face coverings and managing the foot traffic.

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


