PROPOSED RE-OPENING PHASES

Phase 1

June to July 19. Re-opening of Park/Park Areas, Non-District/Permitted Day Camps, Specific Concessionaires

Phase 2

July 20. Re-opening of more Park/Park Areas, Limited Programming, More Concessionaires, Boating, Swim Areas, and Group Camp and Picnic Areas

Phase 3

Pending Public Health Directives. Reopen remaining Park/Park Areas, Expanded Programming, Possible (but likely limited) access to Visitor Centers, and Reservable Facilities

Phase 4

Pending Public Health Directives. Resumption of normal functions and reoperation of group picnics areas and group camps, all concessions, large scale special events, and all reservations.

PHASE 1: Parks & Park Areas to Reopen

June 1:

- Point Isabel Regional Shoreline
- Mission Peak – Stanford Avenue Staging
- Roberts Recreation Area – Ballfield

June 12:

- Sibley - Old Tunnel Road
- Crown Beach - Otis Parking lot
- MLK Jr. - Tidewater

June 27:

- Botanic Garden

PHASE 1: Concessionaires & Special Uses

Coming Soon!

- Mid-June: Equestrian Centers / Stables – private
- Allow special uses to resume at Shadow via walk-in:
 - Open water swim
 - Portuguese Water Dogs



PHASE 1: Permitted Day Camps



- Starting June 15: 7 Outside Day Camp Organizations @ 13 Locations
- More may be added in July & August
- Adhere to County/State guidelines:
 - Groups of 12
 - 3 weeks minimum
 - Camps actively mobile through walking and hiking programs
- Utilize open public restrooms
- May bring own tables

PHASE 2: Parks/Park Areas to Reopen

July 20:

- ACT – Restrooms
- Anthony Chabot – Marciel Parking Lot, Family Picnic Areas
- Ardenwood Historic Farm
- Big Break – Family Picnic Areas
- Black Diamond Mines – Upper Parking Lot
- Briones – Family Picnic Areas
- Carquinez – Family Picnic Areas
- Contra Loma – Parking Lot, Family Picnic Area
- Coyote Hills – Family Picnic Areas, Parking Lot
- Crockett Hills – Family Picnic Areas
- Crown Beach – McKay Parking Lot, Family Picnic Areas
- Del Valle Regional Park – Main gate, Family picnic areas
- Diablo Foothills – Castle Rock Entrance, family picnic areas



PHASE 2: Parks/Park Areas to Reopen

July 20:

- Dry Creek / Pioneer – Meyers Garden, Family Picnic Areas
- Garin – Family Picnic Areas
- Kennedy Grove – Family Picnic Areas
- Lake Chabot – Boat Ramp, Family Picnic Areas
- Martinez Shoreline – Family Picnic Areas
- Miller Knox – Family Picnic Areas
- Oyster Bay – Family Picnic Areas
- Point Pinole – Family Picnic Areas
- Reinhardt Redwood – Family Picnic Areas
- Shadow Cliffs – Main Parking Lot, Family Picnic Areas
- Temescal – South Parking Lot, Family Picnic Areas
- Tilden – South Dr. & Lake Anza Swim Complex, Botanic Garden, Family Picnic Areas
- Wildcat Canyon – Alvarado Picnic Areas



PHASE 2: Family Camping

- Reopen campsites at Anthony Chabot Regional Park and Del Valle Regional Park
- Operate campgrounds at half capacity (every other campsite, No Cabins)
- No group camps (except those used for day use by day camps)
- Reservations Only
- 8-persons / 2 vehicles maximum capacity per campsite, same household/social bubble



PHASE 2: Backpacking Camps



- Sibley, Sunol/Ohlone Wilderness, Anthony Chabot, Las Trampas, Morgan Territory, Round Valley, Mission Peak, Black Diamond Mines
- Limited capacity per site, same household / social bubble
- May reduce capacity for social distancing between campsites
- By Reservation Only

PHASE 2: Family Picnicking

All parks to resume family picnicking with following modifications:

- Social distancing between tables – 10 feet
- No reservations; first come, first served
- 8 person maximum from same household / social bubble
- Install educational signage
- Reduced Capacity Max. / Parking at Del Valle and Shadow Cliffs – Social Distancing



PHASE 2: Boating and Vessel Inspection

- Contra Loma, Del Valle, Shadow Cliffs, Quarry Lakes, Lake Chabot Regional Parks
- Implement Social Distancing Vessel Inspection Protocols
- Requires additional staff training for Quagga mussel inspection



PHASE 2: Concessionaires & Special Uses

July 20th:

- Shadow Cliffs Marina
- Del Valle Marina
- Del Valle Watersports (?)
- Lake Anza Café (?)



PHASE 2: EBRPD Day Camps

- Limit to 12 people (10 Children – 2 Adults)
- 3 week minimum (to allow for stability)
- Disinfection protocols / camper health screening
- Social distancing protocols (e.g. staggered drop-offs, 6' minimum activities, grab and go meals, designated restrooms)
- Response plans for sick campers
- Virtual Day Camp Option



PHASE 2: Programs

- Offer limited programs outside of Visitor Centers, focus on **roving and demonstrations**
- Follow social distancing protocols
- Continue virtual programming and self-guided programs
- Pre-registration Only



PHASE 2: Swim Areas



July 20:

- Gate Entry Swim Areas / Pools / Lagoons:
 - **Contra Loma (maybe, lagoon repair project)**
 - Cull Canyon
 - Diablo Foothills
 - Don Castro
 - Lake Anza
 - Lake Temescal
 - Roberts
- Reservation Only (11 AM – 2 PM, 3 PM – 6 PM)
- **Social Distancing Protocols / Health Orders**

PHASE 2: Swim Areas (Continued)



July 20:

- Open Water
 - Del Valle
 - Shadow Cliffs
- Attendance capacity will be monitored through other checkpoints (e.g. kiosks)
 - As an example, Del Valle will limit capacity to 50% of the total available day use parking ~ 550 vehicles

PHASE 3: Parks and Park Areas to Reopen

- Tilden – Indian Camp Parking Lot and Little Farm
- Lake Chabot – Nike Road
- Pending direction from public health agencies:
 - Group Camps and Group Picnic Sites



PHASE 3: Concessionaires, Special Events, Reservable Facilities

- Pending direction from public health agencies, allow limited-capacity resumption of:
 - Outdoor Recreation Classes
 - Special events (e.g. races, etc.)
 - Indoor Reservable Facilities (with capacity limits)
 - High-Touch or High-Contact Concessions:
 - Merry Go Round
 - Train Rides
 - Group Lessons (Stables, Watersports)



PHASE 3: Programs and Visitor Centers



- Pending direction from public health agencies, I&R will:
 - Expand Outdoor Recreation Programming (e.g. fishing and kayaking)
 - Increase Day Camp Capacity (12+)
 - Possibly allow limited access to Visitor Centers
- Offer schools live virtual field trips when schools resume

PHASE 4

Pending health directives, Phase 4 is resumption of all normal operations and activities:

- All parks and park areas open, group camps, picnic areas, and family camping back to full capacity
- All Concessionaires reopened to full capacity
- All Reservable Facilities available for events
- All special events permissible
- Visitor Centers Open
 - Programming and Camps back to full capacity
- Everything's back to normal (?!)
